



GENERAL SAFETY:

- Do not operate in ambient temperatures above those indicated on the luminaire nameplate
- All gasket seals must be clean and undamaged.

- All wiring connections should be capped with UL approved wire connectors.

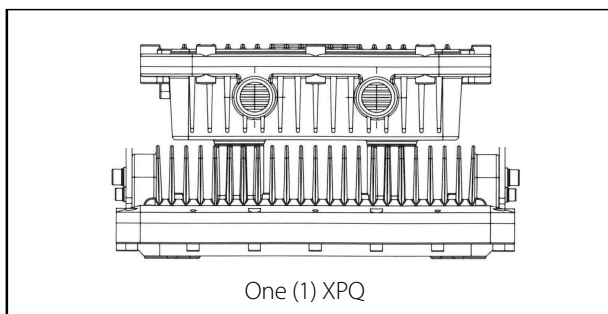

What's In The Box



Tools Needed

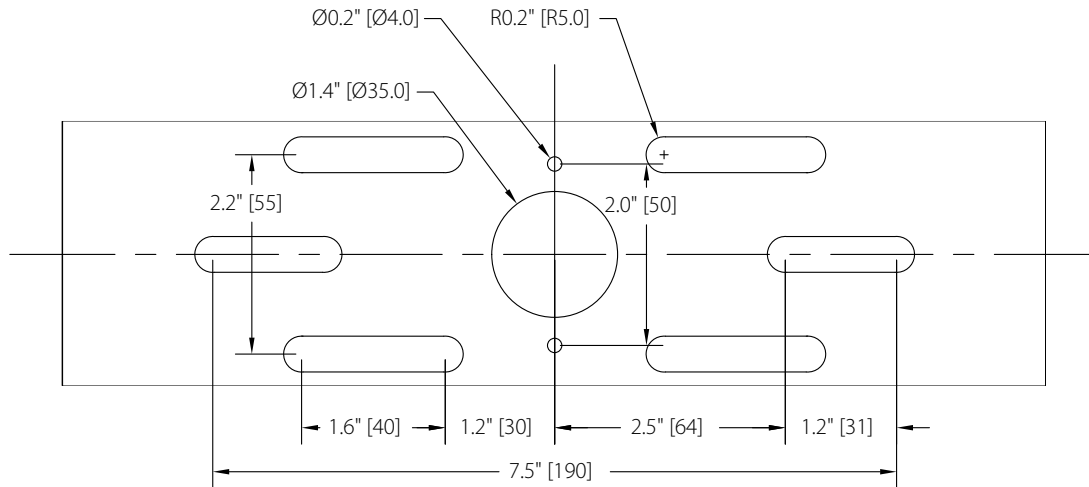
This fixture requires very few tools for installation: A drill, a pair of wire cutter/strippers, allen wrenches, and mounting hardware.



GENERAL INSTALLATION INSTRUCTION For all mounting methods.

- 1) Carefully unpack the fixture from its packaging. Inspect product for defects due to shipping.
- 2) Turn off power to appropriate circuit at the breaker panel.
- 3) Identify mounting location and mounting method. Ensure properly rated mounting hardware is used (mounting hardware not included).

Mounting Bracket Pattern (N.T.S.)



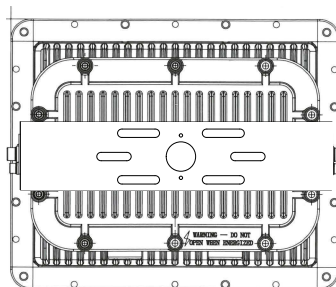
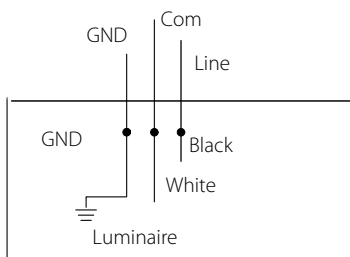
- 4) Loosen hinge and orientation bolts
- 5) Remove mounting bracket.
- 6) Drill mounting holes on surface.
- 7) Mount bracket to surface using appropriate fasteners for the installation surface.
For pendant mount: attach pendant with appropriate fasteners to the mounting bracket.
Fixture weight: 33.1lbs (15kg) - 36.4lbs (16.5kg)
- 8) Reattach fixture to the mounting bracket and adjust fixture to desired angle.
- 9) Remove driver cover enclosure cover.
- 10) Install appropriate conduit connector on the enclosure (3/4" NPT) and connect desired conduit.
- 11) Pull circuit wiring to driver enclosure. Connect wiring as shown in wiring diagram, following all NEC and local codes.
- 12) Reattach enclosure cover and torque bolts to 7 Nm /62 in lbs.
- 13) Turn on power to appropriate circuit and verify fixtures operation.

NOTE: If through wiring is desired remove enclosure plug and install conduit connector

For wire guard accessory

- 1) Remove appropriate bolts from face of fixture and
- 2) A line wire guard and torque bolts back to 7 Nm /62 in lbs.

SERVICING:

- To avoid personal injury, disconnect power to fixture and allow fixture to cool before performing maintenance.
- Perform electrical, mechanical, and visual inspections on a regular basis. The frequency of these inspections is dependent upon the installation environment and frequency of use; it is recommended that these checks be made annually at a bare minimum.
- The external glass should be cleaned periodically to maintain consistent light output and fixture performance. Clean the glass with a clean, damp, non-abrasive, lint-free cloth. If this is not sufficient, a mild soap may be used, but do not use any cleaning agent that is abrasive, strong alkaline, or acidic, as these may damage the fixture.
- Inspect the cooling fins regularly to ensure that they are free of any dust or other contaminants. If necessary, clean with a non-abrasive cloth.
- Check that all mechanical parts are properly assembled and secured.
- Check that all electrical connections are clean, tight, and secure.
